The PLO is very proud and pleased <u>byat</u> the Vatican's announcement that his Holinesses <u>Pope Benedict XVI</u> is planning to visit Palestine and make <u>a pilgrimage</u> to the Holy Land. In this occasion and in perepaetration for the visit we would like to <u>take this opportunity to</u> present you with <u>keycertain</u> messages that we hope will be conveyed by the Holy See

In essence, we hope that <u>H</u>his Holiness <u>will</u> expresses support for a just peace in the Holy Land and the region, in accordance with international law and UN resolutions. In this regard, the historical Arab Peace Initiative <u>provides an ideal framework for a just and</u> <u>comprehensive peace in the region</u>. Such <u>a</u>A peace <u>must be</u> founded upon a solid recognition of the imperative of need to ending the Israeli occupation of Palestinian territory; the right of the Palestinian people to self_-determination and the establishment of an independent sovereign Palestinian state, based on the 1967 border, living side by side to Israel in peace and security₂₅ and a just and agreed upon resolution to the refugees issue in accordance with UN GA resolution 194.

We Palestinians <u>want_seek_the</u> same rights, freedoms and responsibilities enjoyed by other peoples in their states, no more and no less: <u>the ability to liveing</u> free from foreign <u>occupation_domination</u> and oppression<u>as an</u>; independente and sovereignty <u>nation</u>. To that end, the Israeli occupation of all Palestinian territory, including East Jerusalem, which began in 1967 (indeed the longest in modern times), must come to an end.

While the Palestinian people and its representatives remain committed to <u>a just peace</u>, Israel has <u>continued intensified</u> its assault on Palestinian national and individual rights and <u>furtherintensified its policy aimed at entrencheding</u> its colonial occupation, as demonstrated by Israel's unceasing settlement activities, particularly in and around East Jerusalem, as well as its <u>recent</u> military <u>onslaught culminating in the recent</u> attack on <u>the Gaza Strip</u>, which resulted in the death and injury of more than 7,000 Palestinian civilians, the destruction thousands of Palestinian homes and the large—scale destruction of <u>Gaza's civilian</u> infrastructure and thousands of Palestinian homes.

Among the urgent steps needed towards the ending the of Israeli occupation, and in compliance with international law, Israel must immediately cease all settlement activity, and theincluding construction of the Wall; reopenthe reopening of Palestinian institutions in Jerusalem; liftthe lifting the of closure regime in the Gaza Strip and the West Bank; a halt to demolitions of Palestinian homeshouse demolitions; and the ceasessation of all military operations, incursions, assassinations and arrest against Palestinians, particularly those directed at civilians; and the facilitation of movement of people and goods within all occupied Palestinian territory, including the Gaza Strip, East Jerusalem and the West Bank.

<u>As you know, there are few issues of greaterOf immense</u> importance to peace in the region is than that of Jerusalem. The <u>An</u> end of to the Israeli occupation of East Jerusalem and the

realization of Palestinian rights in and sovereignty in <u>over</u> East Jerusalem, as the capital of the Palestinian state, is essential to any lasting peace agreement. We remain tru<u>ethful</u> to our vision of Jerusalem, based on mutual respect and recognition, as an open city <u>containinghousing the</u> two capitals for the two states, East Jerusalem as the capital of Palestine and West Jerusalem as the Capital of Israel, under arrangements that guarantee respect for the status of the <u>H</u>holy <u>Ceity</u> to the three Abrahamic faiths, access to holy sites and the maintenance of the Status Quo.

Diametrically opposed to this vision of peace are Israeli policies <u>of unilateralism</u>, <u>exclusivity</u> and <u>the</u> forceful <u>imposition of</u> facts of the ground <u>that are</u> aimed at altering the <u>historic</u> multicultural <u>historic</u> mosaic of the city. This is done by means of reducing Palestinian presence and severing East Jerusalem from the <u>reminder of occupied Palestinian territoryrest</u> <u>of the West Bank</u>, which resulted, for the first time, in separating the church of the Holy Sepulcher in the Old City of Jerusalem from the Church of Nativity in Bethlehem, and the Haram <u>el-al-Sharimf</u> from the reminder of the Palestinian territory, thus depriving Palestinians<u>and</u> <u>Arabs</u> <u>of</u> Christians and Muslims, as well as other <u>Arabs</u> <u>lifrom both</u> faiths, from accessing their holy sites in Jerusalem. All this is compounded by increased Israeli assaults on the integrity of the Haram <u>el-al-Sharif</u>, <u>the world'sIslam's</u> third holiest <u>shrine site to Muslimsin the world</u>.

The issue of refugees is the <u>an</u>other core issue of the conflict in the Middle East_a, and <u>W</u>without <u>its a</u> just resolution in a comprehensive manner in accordance with international law and UN-GA resolution 194-, there can be no end to the conflict <u>and or</u> lasting peace. Such <u>a</u> resolution rests on three foundations: <u>Israel's</u> recognition <u>by Israel of its</u> responsibility <u>for in</u> the creation <u>of and perpetuation</u> of the refugee problem; the recognition of the right of return; and reparations to the <u>Palestinian refugees</u>, including restitution.

Lastly, Israeli continues to imprisonhold and deprive of liberty more than 11,000 Palestinians political prisoners, crowded in Israeli jails and detention centers. Any movement towards a genuine peace must see the release of all Palestinian and Arab prisoners and their return to their families and homes.

We trust that hH is Holiness will kindly support our efforts aimed at worldly <u>a just and</u> <u>lasting peace</u> in our region by conveying <u>these</u> messages in the spirit of the above said during his visit to the Holy Land.
